## COUPONS CAUSE CONFUSION ON DISCOUNT SITES

Dissect Deals Before Buying Lake Oswego, Ore.

Daily deals on coupon marketing websites—like Groupon and Living Social—may seem tempting, but be wary: Not all discounts are delivered as advertised. While the vast majority of coupon transactions connect reliable businesses with satisfied customers, Better Business Bureau warns that some companies don't keep their end of

the bargain. "Coupon marketing sites offer great incentives for consumers and new opportunities for local businesses," said Robert W.G. Andrew, CEO of BBB serving Alaska, Oregon and Western Washington. "However, undisclosed restrictions and expirations can leave consumers feeling empty-handed." To get the best deal possible, BBB suggests the following considerations: Quality: Check out the com-

pany before buying their coupons or Internet specials. Read customer reviews online and visit bbb.org. Cost: Take a moment to inspect the company's website and regular pricing to see if the discount is really a deal. Timing: Some coupons can only be used on certain days or times. Review offers for expiration dates and fine print. All restrictions should be specified in the deal, according to BBB's Code of Adver-

tising. Convenience: Make sure the coupon is easy to redeem. Find out where the company is located and its hours of operation. Usability: To avoid waitlists and long lines, it's best to sign up or schedule services as soon as possible. When redeeming services, be prepared to provide proof of purchase or a confirmation code.

## Standards Changing For Fluorescent Lighting

(Information furnished by Pacific Power, August 1, 2011)

New national efficacy standards for the manufacture of fluorescent lamps will take effect next July, and now may be an excellent time for businesses to upgrade their fluorescent lamps and ballasts while there are still incentives. The Energy Trust of Oregon provides cash incentives to Pacific Power customers for these types of upgrades, among others.

New federal standards have been enacted that will put an end to the manufacture of T12 lamps and magnetic ballasts by July 2012, making T8 lamps and electronic ballasts the new standard. The newer technology produces better light with less heat, and requires little to no maintenance for up to 20,000 hours of operation. The new standards will help produce continued energy savings and reduce controllable operating costs without compromising lighting quality.

In Oregon, Energy Trust of Oregon, Inc. offers incentives to Pacific Power customers. Businesses that convert now can take advantage of both the new technology and a bonus incentive. At some point the lower efficiency products will no longer be available in the marketplace, affecting supply and demand through 2012. Once T8s are standard practice, financial incentive may no longer be available.

### Take advantage of current incentives

Energy Trust offers incentives from \$10 to \$42 per fixture on upgrades from T12s to T8 lamps with electronic ballasts. For a limited time, a bonus incentive of \$5 per fixture will be added to these standard incentives. Businesses that convert before November 1, 2011, can tap into these additional funds and manage their upgrade on a schedule they control.

## Destination Oregon Leisure and Hospitality Industry Trends

Oregon Labor Trends – June 2011, says average employment in Oregon's leisure and hospitality industry was over 170,000 in 2010 and made up nearly 11 percent of the state's covered employment. Payroll for Oregon's leisure and hospitality industry in 2010 was nearly \$2.8 billion.

Food service makes up the largest segment of leisure and hospitality in Oregon with over 120,000 jobs and 70 percent of the industry's employment. The accommodations sector makes up 15% of Oregon's leisure employment with nearly 25,000 jobs.

Leisure and hospitality employment in Oregon reached its peak in August 2008 with 181,700 people

employed. From that peak to the most recent low in February 2010, leisure employment lost more than 28,000 jobs, a 16 percent decline in 18 months. In 2010, Oregon average employment in leisure and hospitality was the lowest it has been in the last five years. However, the growth in seasonal jobs in 2010 was much greater than in 2009 when the seasonal drop from the August summer high employment was just under 13,000 jobs.

Tourism thrives in the summer months when visitors flock to Oregon's many resort areas, especially the coastal counties, campgrounds, and recreational areas. Charles Kingsbaker, Director of Sales and Marketing for Central Oregon's

Black Butte Ranch confirms that like many of Oregon's other tourism businesses, about 80 to 85 percent of the resort's business occurs between Memorial Day and Labor Day. The Oregon weather is more cooperative during summer, inviting more outdoor activity from residents and visitors.

According to the Oregon Employment Department's unemployment claims information, for claims where industry information is available, the leisure and hospitality industry had the fourth highest average number of claims in 2010 with 7,681. Construction, manufacturing, and retail trade led unemployment claims statewide last year.
